History	
In our unit of learning, we will be discovering what and how do we remember the past.	
Questions to ask my child	Key understanding
What caused the Gunpowder plot?	Catholic people were frightened and there were laws against Catholics which made them more frightened.
How has the Gunpowder Plot been commemorated?	The Houses of Parliament are still searched by Yeoman of Guard. There are poems about it. We have Bonfire Night and a Guy.
When did WW1 begin?	It started in 1914 and finished in 1918
Why did WW1 begin? What caused WW1?	Imperialism meant that countries had been trying to take land so they were frightened. Countries joined teams (alliances). The war was against The Allies and Central Powers. After Archduke Franz Ferdinand was assassinated, the war began.
How did the war change life in England and other countries?	Soldiers lived in trenches and life was hard. Women and children helped in the war effort. More than 18 million people died worldwide. Countries changed shape after the war.
How did WW1 affect our local area?	Many local people fought and died in the war. We can see their names on local statues, plaques etc.
How do people commemorate the end of WW1?	Remembrance Day is celebrated in different ways around the world Poppies are sold. Parades take place.

Science	
In our unit of learning, we will be continuing to investigate living things and their habitats, as well as seasonal change	
Questions to ask my child	Key understanding
How do we know if something is living? What do all living things do?	Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive
Where would this living thing live? How is it suited to this habitat? What can the living thing get from this habitat?	Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other
What lives there? Why does it live there?	Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats
Where does it get it's food from? Why do other living things need it?	Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food



Computing
In computing, we will be learning about spreadsheets and how to use them (using the program 2Calculate)

PSHE
In PSHE, we will be discussing similarities and differences, teaching children the terminology for the parts of the body, exploring permissions and also friendships

PE
Year 2 will be exploring and learning skills within: - gymnastics - Learning how to play invasion games

RE
In RE we will be exploring a theme around how and why light is important at Christmas

Music
In music, Y2 to will be exploring a range of Christmas Songs and 'Ho Ho Ho' in particular Musical notation, rhythm and melody will be taught alongside these songs

Design Technology week
Focus on mechanical—wheels and axels. Y2 will be designing making and evaluating a sleigh for Santa incorporating wheels and axels.

- Writing sentences with different forms—statements and exclamations
- Using full stops and capital letters correctly
- Reading our writing aloud so that it makes sense
