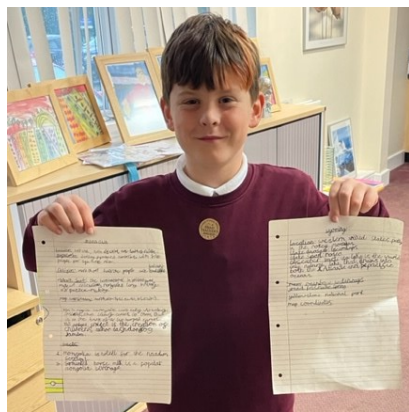

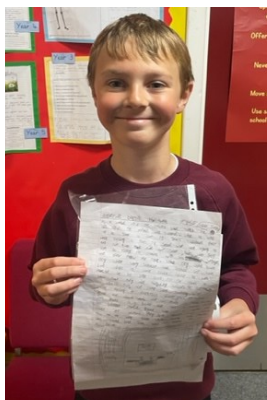

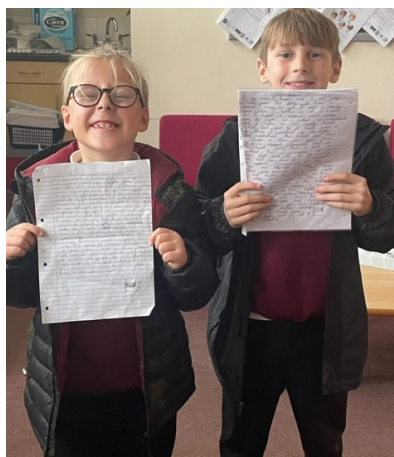


More Amazing Achievements

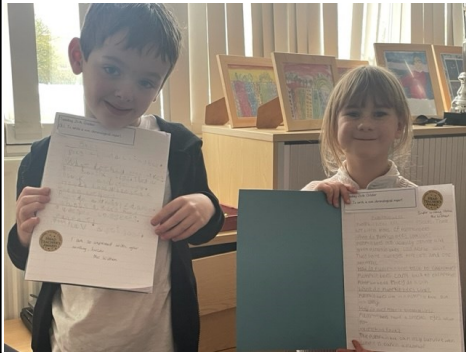
Have a lovely half term break. Thank you for your ongoing support of our happy, nurturing and successful school, and we look forward to seeing you all back on **Monday 6th November**.

What an amazing final week of this half term in school and so many successes in class and at home to celebrate it has made for a very busy newsletter.

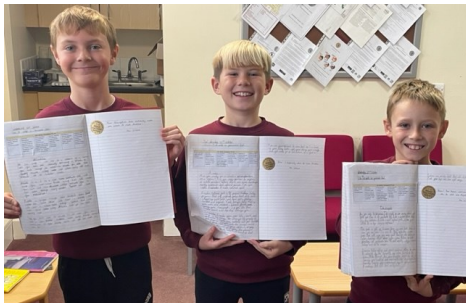
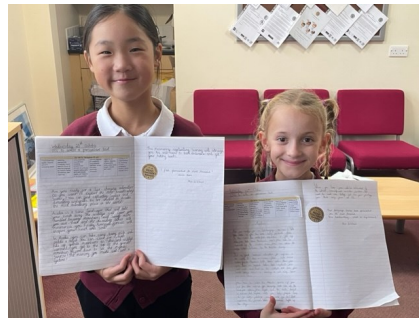


On this page, most of the photos show children from Y2, and Y5 with their utterly fantastic writing. They were all trying to write carefully, use amazing vocabulary



and make their writing very enjoyable to read. They all achieved that very well!

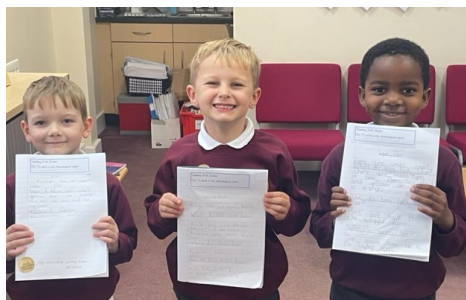
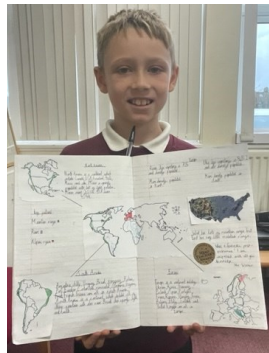

My next visitor came from Y5 with her football trophy and it sounds like she would be the perfect player to have on any team.

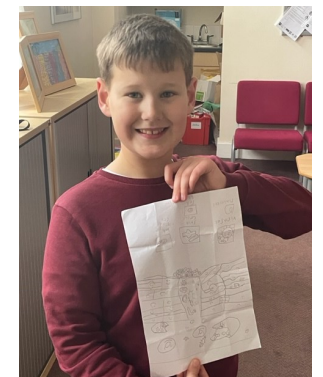
From Y3 my visitor came to share the medal he had achieved in ice hockey.
