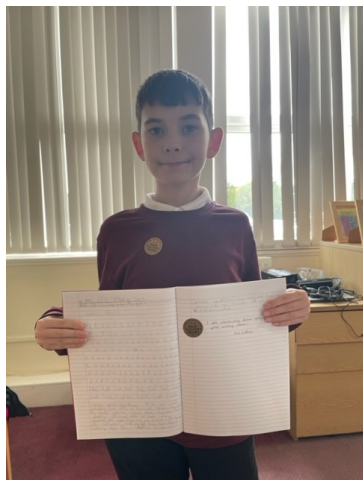

Amazing Successes from Home and in School

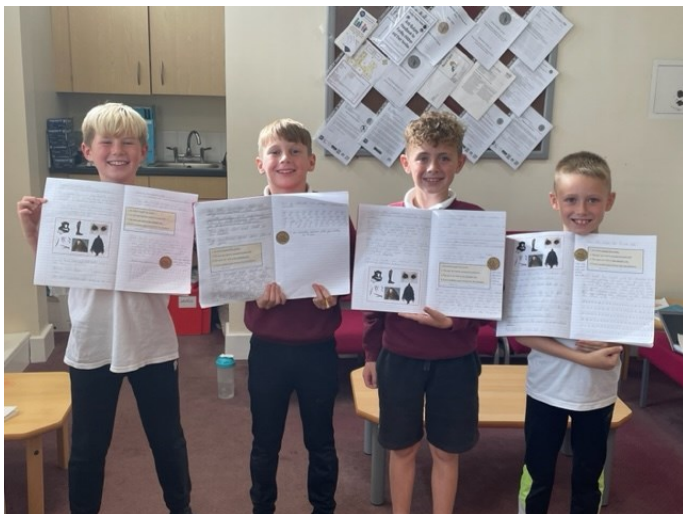


What a fantastic third week of this new school year, with so many successes to share and celebrate.

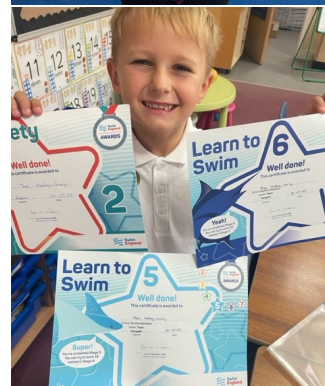
due to cancer treatment and other conditions. Such a lovely gesture.
