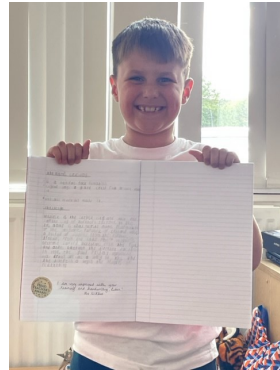

knowledge.

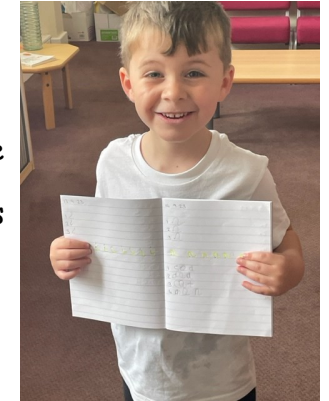
From Y1, my next three visitors came to share the patterns they had made, independently and in pairs, with links. They were proud of the different patterns we could see
