## Successes in school and at home

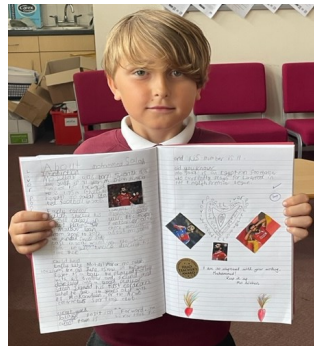


There are so many successes from home and school to share this week, I have struggled to fit them all in!

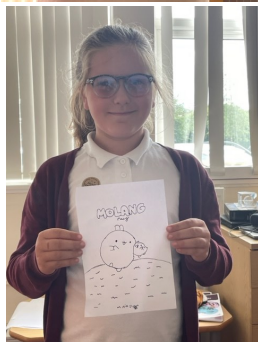
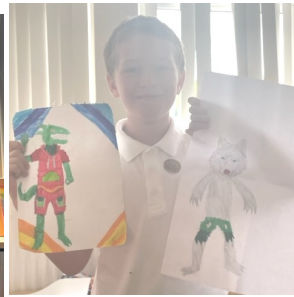
In my first photo you can see three of our Y6 boys who chose to carry out a research project together all about nuclear fission last Friday and they shared this in assembly. I was very impressed with the
