We are part of a network of schools across the north east who focus on giving our children opportunities to develop their creative skills for life as part of their day to day learning.

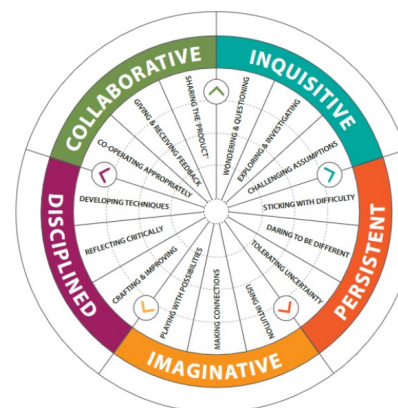
