Successes in school and at home

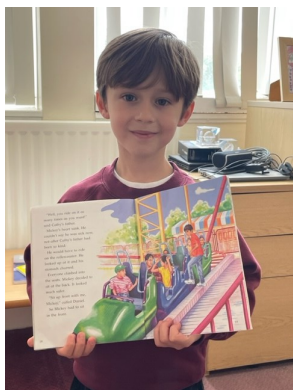
There are so many successes from school and home to share this week, for so many different reasons.
